

FINANCIAL SUMMARY AT DECEMBER 31, 2014

Operating Income: \$439,596.59 (51.53% of budget)

This includes: Offertory, YM & RE fees, bulletin advertising, hall church rental. (Note: Calendar yr 2014 Online Offertory donations increased 17% from prior calendar year to \$98,572.00)

Non-operating Income: \$ 45,908.58 (\$15,940.00 budgeted)

This includes fundraisers - gross golf tournament \$14,213; Share the Vision(STV) \$8,870; \$135,000 still outstanding. These funds are in separate savings account and are reserved for capital expenses.

CSA payments in excess of our goal @12/31/14 is \$22,824 and is in a separate savings account reserved for contingencies, monthly diocesan assessment, or operating if needed.

TOTAL INCOME: \$485,505.17 (55.87% of total \$868,995 budget)

TOTAL EXPENSES: \$400,346.00 (49.29% of Expense Budget)

1. **Program Expenses** - \$38,375.00 Office supplies, postage, printing, books, course materials, dues, background screening.
2. **Facility Expenses** - \$34,112.00 Utilities, repairs & maintenance, security/fire alarm system. Average electric bill for church, parish hall, & rectory combine \$3,500.
3. **Operational** - \$99,659 Independent contractors, yard service, pest control, printer lease mortgage income of \$69,000, bank fees for checking and on line donations.
4. **Travel** - \$5,890 - Diocesan youth conference student subsidy, chaperones, employee training
5. **Property & Liability Insurance** - \$28,872.00 This is half of the year's accrued expense which will be paid in May 2015. The total bill is approximately \$58,000 and we are sending funds to savings to make this payment in May.
6. **Salaries & Benefits** - \$156,168
7. **Direct Diocesan Parish Assessment** - \$35,958.00. This is 4 months of assessment which begins in Sept. each year and is paid in 10 equal payments of \$8,989 per month from Sept. 2014 until June 2015 for a total of \$89,895.
8. **Taxes & Fees and Outreach** - \$1,312. This is tax on leased equipment and payroll processing fees

Summary: We are on the halfway mark for Income & Expenses to budget.

Notes:

- Our monthly mortgage principal & interest payment is \$16,180 with a payoff year in 2031.
- \$10,000 was sent as an extra mortgage principal payment in January 2015.
- New fire alarm panel was installed in church for \$6,023.09 in July 2014.
- Repaired and replaced 25 yr old lift station pump in August 2014 for \$6,220.
- Have begun a Hurricane Deductible Savings Account.
- Will be installing new roof on Parish Hall in coming months.
- We have 596 registered families with 431 (72%) contributing to our parish offertory.

CHARITABLE GIVING IN OUR PARISH - We are grateful for your continuing generosity to our community.

1. National Special/Second Collections: **\$8,485** was generously donated in calendar year 2014 when you checked "Other" on your envelope on these designated dates throughout the year. A copy of these dates is in your envelope box and a letter from the Bishop is in the bulletin the week prior to the special collection.
2. COR and local collections: **\$14,470.60** was collected and distributed monthly to St. Vincent de Paul, Sharing & Caring, Okaloosa County Habitat for Humanity, Child Advocacy Center, and the Migrant Worker Ministry at St. Thomas in Quincy by marking "Other" on your envelope on all other Sundays besides the National Second collections.
3. Through your generosity, over 400 "*Angel Tree*" gifts were donated to St. Vincent de Paul, Catholic Charities, and the Migrant Worker Ministry at St. Thomas in Quincy.
4. We also supported our college student parishioners who participated in the National March for Life, involved Mission projects, and took part in national Catholic workshops.

Note from the Pastor:

While we are fiscally sound and on track with our budget, there is not an excess of funds to pay more down on our mortgage or for future capital projects at this time. I encourage you to prayerfully commit to a lifestyle of Christian stewardship, worship God at Mass each Sunday and make time for personal prayer. Please invest a share of your time to our parish life in a ministry, and give a share of your financial resources with a generous and consistent gift to support the work of your parish family. We strive to be fiscally responsible to cover our operational expenses and pay down our parish mortgage. Thank you to our Finance Council for their guidance and to all members of our banker ministry who count our collection each Sunday and holy day throughout the year.
