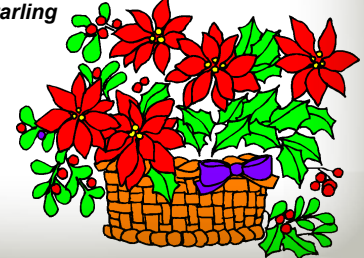

Eucharistic Adoration - Thoughts and Reflections

Eucharistic Adoration offers you quiet personal time, away for life's many demands, to share your life, your concerns, needs, anxieties, beliefs, disbeliefs, pains, problems and joys with our Lord as he remains present to you for an extended period of time. And of most importance, it offers a unique way, along with but outside our formal times of communal worship to get to know Our Lord in an intimate human-to-human way, and from an eternal everlasting viewpoint, a way for him to get to know you. By way of encouragement, some thoughts and reflections:

1. **Anxiety in the house.** A 12 year old boy speaks his very first word of New Testament scripture. From Luke 2: 48-49, it reads: "When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" Reflection: Are we of Christ Our Redeemer when at Eucharistic Adoration not in his Father's house, and does our Redeemer not say to us that he "must be" there?
2. **The kingdom of heaven.** An entry criterion? From Matthew 7:21-23 it reads: "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven. Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name? Did we not drive out demons in your name? Did we not do mighty deeds in your name?' Then I will declare to them solemnly, 'I never knew you.' Depart from me, you evildoers." Reflection: Are we of Christ Our Redeemer during Eucharistic Adoration not offered in a very personal way the opportunity for our Redeemer to get to know us. During Adoration, it is, is it not, clearly evident through our faith, who we are looking at when we look at the white host in the monstrance? But, have we ever considered and thought about, "Who Jesus is gazing upon when he looks back? If we open our hearts and speak to him, in the silence of Adoration, will he not get to know us? Isn't personally speaking with and spending time with someone the way we get to know anyone?"
3. **A Beggar's lament.** "...you do not realize..." From a church approved private revelation* we learn that during one vision that occurred at Holy Mass, Jesus and Mary appeared to her (visionary), and showed her visions of what was really happening during Holy Mass. Toward the end of Mass after communion and just as the celebrant said the final "Let us pray", Jesus talked to her about how almost all of those who had come to receive him, never thanked him. Then he said, "I have died for love and I am risen. For love I await each one of you, and for love I remain with you... But you do not realize that I need your love. Remember that I am the Beggar of Love in this sublime hour for the soul." Reflection: Is it not reasonable, that we of Christ Our Redeemer during Eucharistic Adoration as he gazes upon us are also being told by that same beggar that he needs our love?
4. **Two questions.** Only hearts can answer. (1.) When I die, and I am going to die, how much time do I want to spend in heaven with Jesus? (2) Now, while I can before I die, how much time am I willing to spend with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration? Reflection: Before he arrived in heaven, St. Pope John Paul II seemed to want to encourage us. For in his very first encyclical, one which bears our name, under the title, "The Redeemer of Man" he writes, "Our essential commitment in life is to preserve and advance constantly in Eucharistic life and Eucharistic piety and to grow spiritually in the climate of the Holy Eucharist." He also writes, "Our communal worship at Mass must go together with our personal worship of Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration in order that our love may be complete." Could it be that with a little imagination, had we been there when he did arrive in heaven, we might have heard Jesus say, "You were right John Paul, I need your love."?
