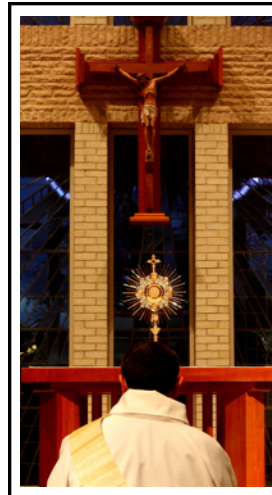

A CSA UPDATE FROM THE PASTOR

- **Our 2016 Parish Assessment is \$180,791.50.** The 2016 Catholic Sharing Appeal (CSA) goal is half, or \$90,395.75. The other half is directly billed to the parish over 10 months (Sept-June) and in our fiscal year budget.
- ***159 out of 568 families (28%)** have pledged \$55,846.50 towards the \$90,395.75 CSA goal.
- ***\$31,327 (34.6%) has been received** by the Diocese as of March 1, 2016.

Last year, you generously donated \$117,044 and the over goal amount of \$27,149 was returned to our parish savings account.

PLEASE TURN IN YOUR PLEDGE CARDS in the Offertory Basket or mail directly to the Diocese and make your checks out to the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee, Attn: CSA, P.O. Box 13284, Pensacola, Florida 32591.

3 WAYS TO GIVE:

1. **GO TO OUR WEBPAGE CORCATHOLIC.ORG** and hit the CSA button to make a one-time contribution or set up a recurring giving schedule.
2. **MAIL YOUR CHECKS DIRECTLY TO THE DIOCESE OF PENSACOLA TALLAHASSEE**, CSA Office, P.O. Box Pensacola, FL and include your Family ID# (from your pledge card) in the memo field.
3. **USE YOUR WEEKLY OR MONTHLY PARISH ENVELOPES**. The parish will send all designated amounts to the Diocese during the last week of the month. (In cases where the parish check is not received at the Diocese by the last day of the month, the donations are posted the date they are received and will be on that next month's statement.) If you do not designate your donation on your envelope, the Pastor and Parish Finance Council have authorized that 10% of your donation be sent to CSA (regardless of a pledge). This has helped us reach our goal every year and contributed to the over goal amount that is returned to our parish savings account.

THE MORE YOU KNOW

***Whichever way you choose to give**, you will receive a statement each month (dated the last date of the month) from the Diocese unless you specifically tell them to stop.

***Donations** (and down payments) made from Feb 2016 thru Jan 2017 will be credited to the 2016 CSA year (for tax purposes, only 2016 calendar year donations will be on your contribution letter).

*** CSA continues to be our opportunity** to help the programs and services and functions coordinated from the Pastoral Center that benefit and support us at the parish level. A few of these functions are Education and Formation, Tribunal (Canon Law: annulments, marriage dispensations, etc.), fulfilling Sacraments, Social Service and Outreach, Diocesan wide youth activities and conferences, Catholic Foundation and Development, Vocations and Evangelization, Administrative (HR, finance and accounting, protection of children, young people, and vulnerable adults), and capital funding.

***Participating in the diocesan annual appeal** allows every parishioner an opportunity to materially touch the lives of so many people across the diocese that they otherwise would never be able to lend a helping hand and helps us become *"A Church Fully Alive"*.
