SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

IT WAS A BEAUTIFUL and blessed afternoon this past Saturday at Saint Vincent de Paul. The "*Little Flower Club*" from Christ Our Redeemer came to our pantry. They brought can goods and paper products for all those who are in need. They had a tour of the pantry and learned how Saint Vincent de Paul helps our neighbors who do not have enough to eat and very little money to purchase nutritious food for their families.

THE GIRLS LEARNED that this food comes to us through donations from Chris Our Redeemer and Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Churches and from the Bay Area Food Bank. Each girl was then given a grocery bag to place the can goods and paper products they had brought and were asked to help us by filling their bags with more canned goods from our shelves. When the girls had their bags overflowing with groceries they were asked who was going to receive these items that they had packed? They said those who are in need of food.

BEFORE LEAVING THEY swept our floor and picked up papers that were lying around and made the pantry look great. Saint Vincent de Paul wants to thank all these young ladies for their care and love for those less fortunate than them. *The children will lead us.*
