### Our History

Unless otherwise posted, the Council's General Assembly convenes on the first Thursday of each month and the Executive Committee meets on the fourth Thursday of each month. Both meetings are conducted in the Christ Our Redeemer Parish Hall at 7:00 PM.

Fourth Degree members of Council 13527 and Council 7667 comprise Assembly 3236. The Fourth Degree Assembly convenes on the third Thursday of each month, alternating meeting locations between Christ our Redeemer Parish (even months) and Holy Name of Jesus Parish (odd months).

In June 2004, the Knights of Columbus conferred the Charter establishing Council 13527 at Christ Our Redeemer Parish. On July 1, 2004, our first Grand Knight, Len Casey, convened the Council's inaugural meeting and fraternal year. The Council earned the Star Award that year and Double Star Awards each of the next five years. In 2007-2008, under the leadership of Past Grand Knight, Jack Starr, 13527 earned the Best Florida Council (Division II) distinction. In 2009, Sir Knight Dave Halupowski was honored as the State of Florida Knight of the Year.

## Saint of the Month – October 2016

### St. Mother Theodore Guerin, (1798-1856)

Feast Day: October 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Patron Saint of: Roman Catholic Diocese of Lafayette in Indiana.



St. Mother Theodore Guerin was a missionary who established schools in Indiana at the same time that Father Sorin founded Notre Dame.

She was born as Anne Therese in 1798 in France in the wake of the French Revolution. Her father was an officer in the French navy under Napoleon. When Anne was 15, he was killed by bandits, and her mother fell into a deep depression. Anne cared for her siblings and her mother for ten years, tending to the household. She had a deep-seated desire to enter the convent, even as a young child, and when she was 25 years old, she finally did so.

As a nun, she took the name Theodore and became a teacher. For a dozen years, she taught in central France and cared for the poor who lived near her. She became very sick with smallpox, nearly dying. The disease ravaged her digestive system, and for the rest of her life, she was limited to a simple, bland diet.

Her community, the Sisters of Providence, recognized her leadership skills and sent her with five others to a mission territory in America — Indiana, which was then part of a French diocese. This was the same diocese to which Father Sorin and seven Holy Cross brothers were sent to serve as missionaries in 1842, when they founded the University of Notre Dame.

When Father Sorin arrived at the site where the University was to grow, he found a simple log cabin that served as a center for missionary activity in the area. Mother Theodore had a similar experience — she and her sisters traveled by steamboat and stagecoach, and arrived in the middle of the Indiana wilderness to find a simple farmhouse, and that's where they started to build.

In 1841, Mother Theodore and her sisters opened St. Mary of the Woods near Terre Haute, Indiana, the first liberal arts Catholic college for women in the United States. Under her leadership, the community went on to establish more schools and orphanages throughout Indiana. She also served the communities surrounding some of these schools by adding pharmacies that dispensed free medicine to poor people.

One of the miracles that enabled her 2006 canonization happened to Phil McCord, a man living in Terre Haute. He helped maintain the facilities of the Sisters of Providence, but was losing his eyesight. With one eye 20/800 and the other 20/1000, he was legally blind, and was about to have an operation. He prayed to Mother Guerin for strength to undergo the surgery and when he woke up the next day, his eyesight was 20/20. The only treatment he needed was a laser procedure to remove old tissue.
